Warm Up (10 mins)

- Stretches and breathing
- Vocal technique exercises, ascending and descending
- Vowel blending and ear training

Lesson/Classwork (30 mins)

- Sectionals: Review harmonies and vocal technique parts for songs with new CV or returning quarantined students for recording of concert on Friday
- Run songs as a group with the accompaniment as dress rehearsal:
- You're a Mean One Mr. Grinch
 - Sing through melody together
 - Harmony splits
 - Tenor Bass
 - Soprano Alto
 - Practice vocal techniques for each section (accents, staccato, etc.)
- Holly Jolly
 - Run the song with repeats
 - Focus on rhythmic, melodic, and harmonic accuracy, entrances/exits, transitions, and repeats.

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Lesson/Classwork (30 mins)

- Place students on stage, spaced safely and with microphones as needed
- Run songs as a group with the accompaniment as dress rehearsals before recording the final takes
 - You're a Mean One Mr. Grinch
 - Holly Jolly
- Students will practice good audience etiquette while watching the other choirs perform their concert pieces.

Closing Activity/Notes

Cool Down (2 mins)

- Neck rolls and breathing exercises
- Save virtual music, store paper copies
- Final words/review/assigned work
