Rehearsal Techniques, Solfege, Sight singing

Lesson Objective/ Essential Questions

Objectives:

- Explain and exhibit proper rehearsal expectations and techniques, such as posture, breathing, and singing fully on pure vowels.
- Sing fully during warm ups
- Singing accurate pitches in tune using correct solfege syllables
- Sight sing melodies using solfege syllables
- Continue rehearsal of Concert pieces:
 - "Dust in the Wind"

 - Sections will label the Violin solo part (8 measures) using solfege and practice singing it as a group.
 - When ready, sections can put harmonies together
